All students with learning differences and attention challenges receive the instruction and support they need – regardless of where they attend school or whether they have a formal diagnosis.

Our Programs

Hill supports students, educators, and families with programs that meet the needs of students with learning differences, attention challenges, gaps in foundational academic skills, and difficulties with executive function.



Student Programs: Hill serves students in grades K-12 through school, summer, and tutoring programs at Hill and in local schools. Students receive individualized instruction in reading, writing, math, and executive function skills they need to succeed in school and in life.



Professional Learning: Hill offers professional development for K-12 teachers and schools, providing an understanding of learning disabilities and ADHD and how to deliver research-based instruction and intervention.



Family and Community Engagement: Hill helps families better understand, support, and advocate for their children, offering relevant resources, online learning, and community education and partnerships.

Our Strategy

Hill aspires to **deepen local impact** and **become a stronger resource** to the Triangle community by pursuing three goals:



Strengthen Programs: Invest in strengthening Hill's programs for students and educators and supports for families.

Expand Access: Expand access to Hill's programs for students and educators at Hill and in local schools.

Engage the Community: Engage the community to better support local families of children with learning differences who are not being served at Hill.

Priority 1

Hill Fund

The Hill Fund supports every facet of Hill, including our talented educators, research-based programs, and optimal learning environment. For example:

- Ensuring small group instruction with supplemental supports to meet each student's unique needs.
- Investing in advanced multisensory math and structured literacy certifications for Hill faculty.
- Providing families with dynamic data and resources to better support their children at home and at school.

Priority 2 **Expanding Access**

Every dollar raised goes directly to supporting a student or teacher at Hill or in local public schools. For example:

- Increasing financial aid for school, summer, and tutoring programs, as well as scholarships for public school teacher professional development.
- Expanding Literacy Intervention Tutoring (LIT) and teacher training and support in local schools and school districts.
